Big Data, machine learning, and artificial intelligence (AI) – the digital turn has significantly transformed the scientific study of texts in recent years. Extensive digital text data open up new fields of research in the humanities and social sciences and enable the application of computer-assisted methods. Machine learning and AI facilitate extensive analyses of natural language.

At the international conference "Words in Numbers - Data-Driven Approaches to Texts in the Humanities and Social Sciences" are data science methods in disciplines such as Theology, Religious Studies, History, Linguistics, Social Sciences, and Law emphasized. The conference is particularly aimed at early-career researchers who use computer-assisted methods in their research or are interested in these techniques.
